Fall 2013 Enrollment Profile

- The Fall 2013 unduplicated enrollment of 2,203 represents a decrease of 276 students or -11.2% from Fall 2012. The unduplicated enrollment for Spring 2013 was 2,170.
- Females make up 60% of total enrollment, 58% of undergraduate enrollment, and 75% of the graduate enrollment.
- Fifty-nine percent of students are commuters. Approximately 902 students reside in campus housing.
- Based on enrollment, 1,641 of our currently enrolled students or 75% are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (550), Washington (225), Sunflower (209), Humphreys (120), and Bolivar (106) counties.
- Seventeen percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 60% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 492 or 22% part-time students.
- There are 493 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 392 entering freshmen in Fall 2012. This represents an increase of 26%.
- The average ACT composite remained the same as Fall 2012 for entering freshmen at 17.1.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 330. The percentage of enrollment for out-of-state students is 15%. Most of these students are from Illinois (72), Tennessee

(60), and Georgia (44); followed by California (26) and Texas (15).

- Other Race students make up 5% of the total enrollment. Seventy-seven of the Other Race students are White. White enrollment decreased from Fall 2012 by 7.
- There are 678 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 78 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 34% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 32. The majority are from Nigeria.
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (223), HPER (211), Social Work (196), and Biology (188), followed by Criminal Justice (165) and Early Childhood Education (153). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (66), Social Work (61), and MBA (40).
