Spring 2011 Enrollment Profile

- The Spring 2011 enrollment of 2,524 students decreased by 112 students (-4.3%) from Fall 2010. It represents an 8% decrease from Spring 2010 enrollment of 2,732.
- Females make up 65% of total enrollment, 62% undergraduate enrollment, and 77% of the graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-four percent or (1,616) of students are commuters. Approximately 908 students reside in campus housing.
- 2,008 of our currently enrolled students (80%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (743), Washington (300), Sunflower (272), Bolivar (134), and Holmes (118) counties followed by Coahoma (112).
- Ten percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 68% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 719 or 29% part-time students.
- There are 43 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 52 entering freshmen in Spring 2010.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.0. This is compared to an average of 17.2 in Fall 2010 and 17.7 in Spring 2010.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 214. The percentage of enrollment out-of-state students is 9%. Most of these students are from Illinois (47), Tennessee (43), and

Texas (20) followed by California and Louisiana (14), and Georgia (13).

- White students make up 4% of the total enrollment. The number of White students did not decrease from Fall 2010. It remains at 98.
- There are 107 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 28 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 4% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 15. The majority are from Canada (14).
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Social Work (250), Business Administration (231), HPER (192), Early Childhood Education (185), and Elementary Education (176) followed by Biology (174) and Criminal Justice (146). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (153), Social Work (83), and MAT (60).
