Spring 2013 Enrollment Profile

- The Spring 2013 enrollment of 2,170 students decreased by 309 students or 13% from Fall 2012. It represents a 7% decrease from Spring 2012 with an enrollment of 2,324.
- Females make up 63% of total enrollment, 61% undergraduate enrollment, and 73% of the graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-six percent or (1,440) of students are commuters. Approximately 730 students reside in campus housing.
- 1,728 of our currently enrolled students (78%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (621), Washington (275), Sunflower (210), Bolivar (120), and Holmes (104) counties followed by Coahoma (93) and Humphreys (86).
- Twenty-two percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 65% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 609 or 28% part-time students.
- There are 32 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 36 entering freshmen in the Spring of 2012.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.3. This is compared to an average of 17.1 in Fall 2012 and 17.0 in Spring 2012.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 234. The percentage of enrollment out-of-state students is 11%. Most of these students are from Tennessee (57), Illinois (51), Georgia (19), and California (18).

- Other Race students make up 5% of the total enrollment. The number of White students decreased from Fall 2012. It now stands at 69.
- There are 86 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 25 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 5% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 27. The majority are from Canada (12).
- The most popular undergraduate majors are Business Administration (222), HPER (215), Social Work (210), Biology (176), Early Childhood Education (175), and Criminal Justice (171). The most popular graduate majors are Criminal Justice (89), Social Work (70), and Masters of Arts in Teaching (47).
