# **Booster Shot and Third Dose Information**

Additional COVID-19 vaccine doses can improve protection against COVID-19 for older adults, those with certain medical conditions, and other groups at higher risk.

### Booster doses

Booster doses provide additional immunity when the immune response from the first two vaccine doses has decreased over time (at least 6 months).

## o Third vaccine doses

Third doses benefit those with severely compromised immune systems when given at least 4 weeks after a two-dose Pfizer or Moderna vaccine series.

## **Booster Vaccinations**

A single booster dose is recommended for certain groups, based on the type of COVID-19 vaccine they have already received.

#### Pfizer and Moderna

For those who have already received both doses of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine at least six months ago, the following groups are eligible for a booster dose.

- Adults aged 65 years and older
- Long-term care facility residents
- Adults aged 18 and older with certain <u>underlying medical conditions</u> (see below)
- Adults aged 18 and older in high risk settings that increase their risk of exposure:
  - o First responders (healthcare workers, firefighters, police, congregate care staff)
  - o Education staff (teachers, support staff, daycare workers)
  - Food and agriculture workers
  - Manufacturing workers
  - Corrections workers
  - o U.S. Postal Service workers
  - Public transit workers
  - Grocery store workers

#### Johnson & Johnson

Anyone 18 and older who was vaccinated with Johnson & Johnson (Janssen) vaccine at least **two** months ago is eligible for a booster.

#### Mixing vaccine types

Eligible individuals may receive a booster dose of **any** of type of COVID-19 vaccine currently available: Moderna, Pfizer or Johnson & Johnson.

## **Getting a Booster Dose**

- Get the booster on campus at the heath center (Infirmary). To schedule an appointment call (662) 644-4865.
- Check with your doctor, a pharmacy, or other vaccination provider about getting a COVID-19 booster dose. Find a vaccination provider »

# **Third Vaccine Doses**`

A third dose of COVID-19 vaccine can provide added protection if you have a medical condition that affects your immune system and you are at high risk for developing more serious illness from COVID-19.

Third vaccine doses are available only for those who received Moderna or Pfizer vaccine, and whose last shot was at least 4 weeks ago.

# **Qualifying Conditions**

You qualify for a third dose of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine if you:

- Have been receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood
- Received an organ transplant and are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- Have moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome)
- Have advanced or untreated HIV infection
- Are receiving active treatment with high-dose steroids or other drugs that may suppress your immune response
- Have any other medical condition that your provider says will limit your immune response

# **Getting a Third Dose**

You can schedule an additional vaccination dose at a county health department or through your doctor or regular health care provider.

• Make an appointment at the Health Center (Infirmary) (662) 644-4865

- **Consult your doctor** or a health care provider. They can evaluate your health status and determine whether you need an additional vaccination dose. If you do, they will provide the vaccination.
- Schedule a third dose appointment at a county health department
