Each child should be assigned one of the listed roles: Hansel, Gretel, step-mother, father, and witch. This should be done by having the students draw names out of a hat. Day 2-3 The teacher should then give each group a little practice time with a tape of the story so they know kind of what they are going to do when they perform their own version. Day 4-5 Each group will perform their own version of the story. It is important to emphasize throughout this assignment that the students should work together to make this as meaningful as they can.
