Day 4. Independent Practice: In small groups learning groups

TSW: Read three more sets of stories following the same routine done in day three, identifying the elements, transferring them to a Venn diagram to compare and the contrast the elements, and develop a constructed response telling if the stories are more alike than different or more different than alike.

Day 5: TTW use two additional stories "The Race Between Hummingbird and Crane" and "The Tortoise and the Hare" to compare and contrast using a Venn diagram. After which, students will describe the stories' elements and using details from the story, compare and contrast each component in a one paragraph response.

Reteach- Read and discuss the stories together. Students will identify characters, setting, and plot then write a one paragraph response.	
Enrichment- Students will read stories independently; identify characters, setting, plot, and theme, determine the archetype for each; and write a longer response comparing and contrasting the elements of the story. All responses will be presented to the class on day 4.
