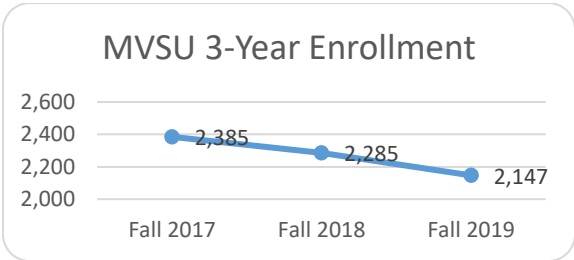




## FALL 2019 ENROLLMENT PROFILE

- The Fall 2019 unduplicated **enrollment of 2,147** students represents a decrease of 138 students, or -6.0%, over the Fall 2018 enrollment of 2,285 students. It is 6% higher than the Spring 2019 enrollment of 2,034 students.
- **57%** of students are **commuters**. Approximately 922 live on campus.
- **65%** or 1,385 students are from surrounding **Delta counties**. Most are from Leflore (451), Washington (236), Sunflower (206), Humphreys (108) and Coahoma (84) counties.
- **24%** of students are from **out-of-state**. Most are from Tennessee (131) and Illinois (67), followed by Georgia (53) and Texas with (46). There are **34 international** students, most are from Nigeria.
- **4%** of students are **Other-Race**, including **42 White** students.
- There are **612 new students** (500 are undergraduates (First-time freshmen, New Transfers, Non-Formula Students) and 112 graduates) who represent 29% of total enrollment.
