

# Mississippi Valley State University

## Spring 2014 Enrollment Profile

- The Spring 2014 enrollment of 2,105 students decreased by 98 students or 4.4% from Fall 2013. It represents a 3% decrease from Spring 2013 with an enrollment of 2,170.
- Females make up 61% of total enrollment, 59% undergraduate enrollment, and 77% of the graduate enrollment.
- Sixty-three percent or (1,333) of students are commuters. Approximately 772 students reside in campus housing.
- 1,566 of our currently enrolled students (74%) are from surrounding Delta counties. Most are from Leflore (518), Washington (240), Sunflower (201), Humphreys (115), and Bolivar (110) counties followed by Holmes (85) and Coahoma (84).
- Twenty percent of undergraduates are part-time students while 60% of graduate students are part-time. Overall, the student body is comprised of 517 or 25% part-time students.
- There are 31 First-Time Freshmen (FTF) compared to 32 entering freshmen in the Spring of 2013.
- The average ACT composite for entering freshmen is 17.5. This is compared to an average of 17.1 in Fall 2013 and 17.3 in Spring 2013.
- The raw number of out-of-state students is 308. The percentage of enrollment out-of-state students is 15%. Most of these students are from Illinois (64), Tennessee (51), Georgia (41), and California (26).

- Other Race students make up 5.2% (110) of the total enrollment. The number of White students increased by 14 students from Fall 2013. It now stands at 83 or 3.9%.
- There are 78 new undergraduates students. This includes new freshmen, transfers, and Non-formula students 21 and older. Also, there are 26 new graduate students. Altogether, new students represent 4.9% of the total enrollment.
- Enrollment for International students stands at 28. The majority are from Canada (9).
- The most popular undergraduate majors are HPER (215), Business Administration (205), Social Work (198), Biology (178), Criminal Justice (159), and Early Childhood Education (158). The most popular graduate majors are Social Work (70), Criminal Justice (60), and Masters of Business Administration (52).
